Defining specific duties for special education teachers. i.e. how many classes, how much time spent on testing, how many students in case load.
Teachers only teaching 4 classes with 1 more ERAP for IEPs and case load work, if another section opens up
Being told that 6 periods are not available for Special Education teachers. When a member is released to do something, it precludes you from taking on an extra sections. (a member cannot be 1.2 but only teaching 5 classes). This is an issue that the negotiating team will be looking into.
